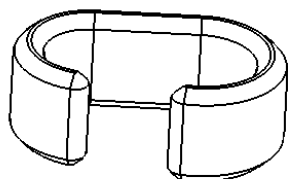
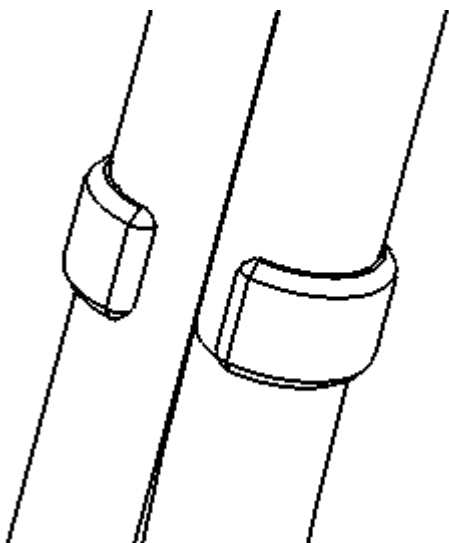


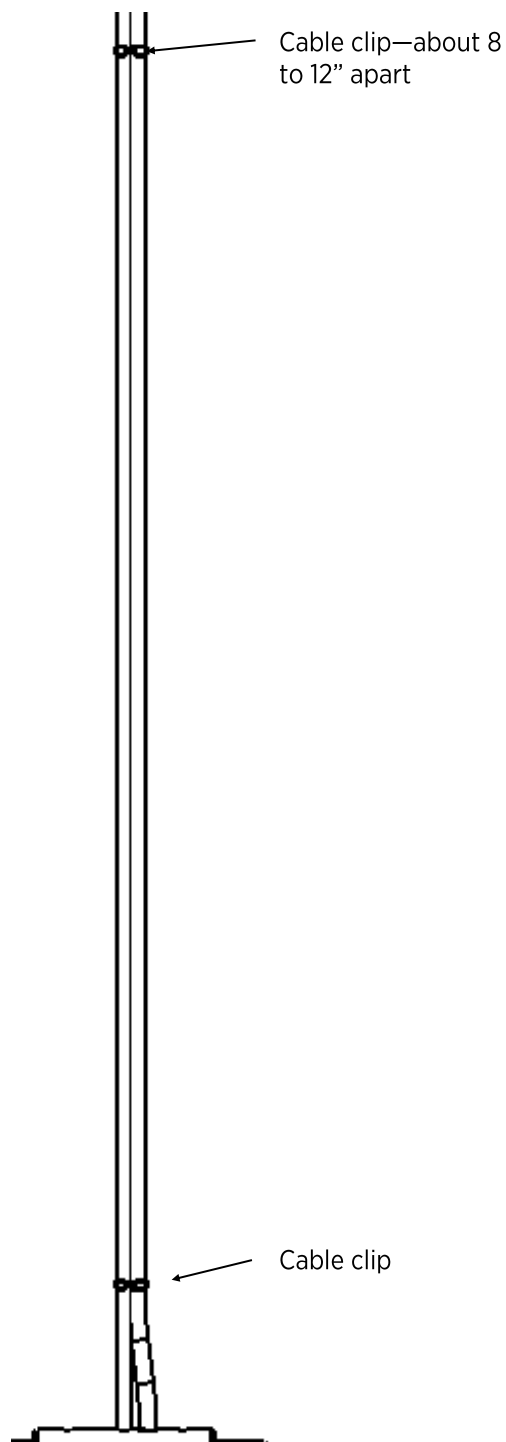
Step 15: Snip the coaxial wire in the canopy so that 10" length of wire is available in the canopy. Strip outer sheath of coaxial cable off, and twist outer conductor together. Attach outer conductor (-) to the purple wire (-) on the driver. Strip and attach inner conductor (+) to red wire (+) on driver. Place the cover back onto the canopy. Use the provided plastic clips to connect the coaxial power wire to the aircraft cable, clipping them on roughly every foot.



Clear Cable Clip for wire management



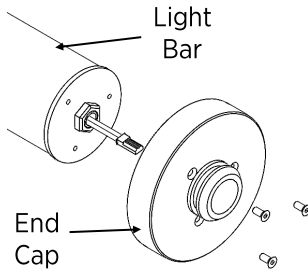
Install Cable clip on coax wire first then clip to the aircraft cable



Step 7: Connect the end housings (E) to the cable grippers by inserting the aircraft cable into the cable gripper. Adjust all three housings to the desired height by pushing the aircraft cable further into the gripper. They should all be at the same height.

Note: If the aircraft cable is pushed too far into the gripper push up on the gripper to release tension on the cable and pull back through the gripper.

Step 8: Remove the light bar end cap from one side by unscrewing the three countersunk screws using the provided 2mm Allen key.

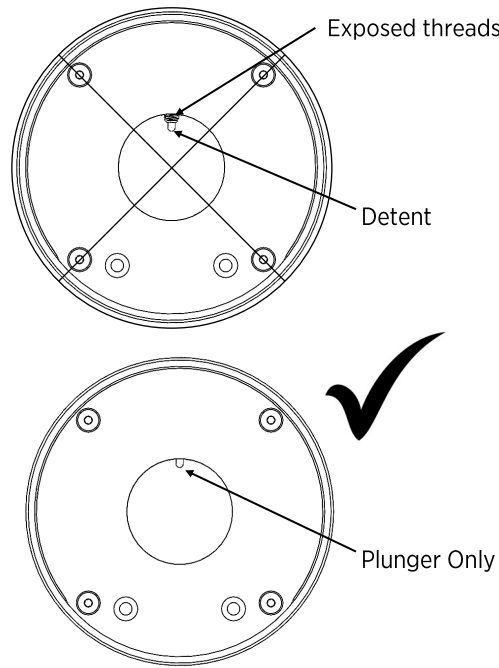


Step 9: Stretch and run Silicone Stone Spacers over the Large Clear glass tube (not the smaller white glass tube of the light bar), placing the 8 of them at each of the locations shown in **figure 1**. Run the Stone Cylinders over the Glass Tube and place them on top of the Silicone Spacers.

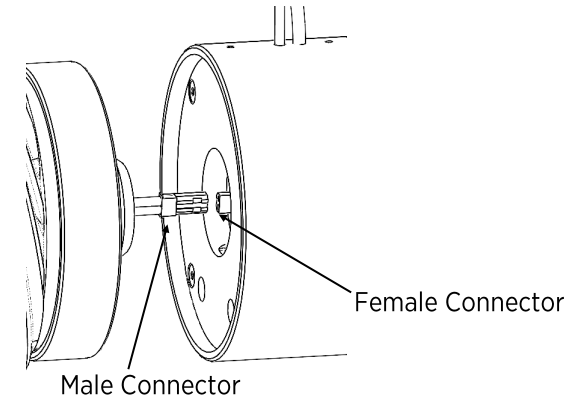
Step 10: Run Large Clear glass tube with Silicone Stone Spacers and Stone cylinders over the light bar, ensuring to place a silicone washer between the end caps and the Large Clear tube. Once Glass Tube is in place, re-attach end cap.

Note: Do not over tighten the 3 small screws that hold the end cap onto the light bar

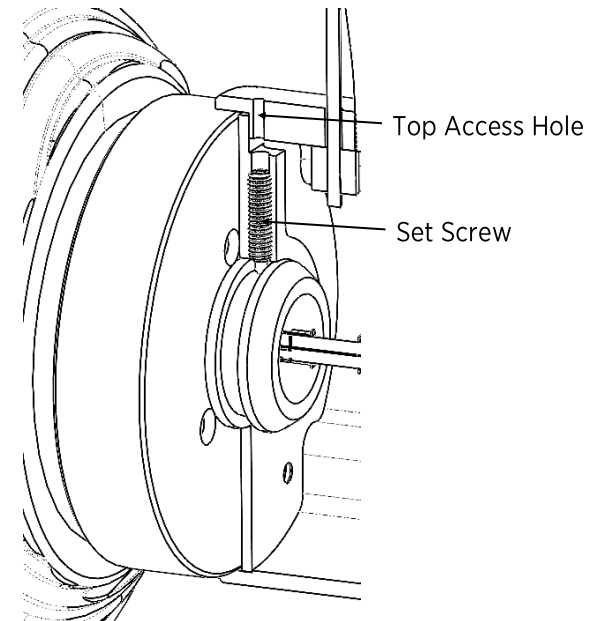
Step 11: Make sure the spring plungers on both the center and end housings have only the detent shown. If you see threads, back this out using the .050" Allen Wrench until only the detent is shown.



Step 12: Bring the assembled light bar up to the end housing and make the electrical connection by plugging in the male end of the red connector to the female end. Once the electrical connection is made push wires into the end housing

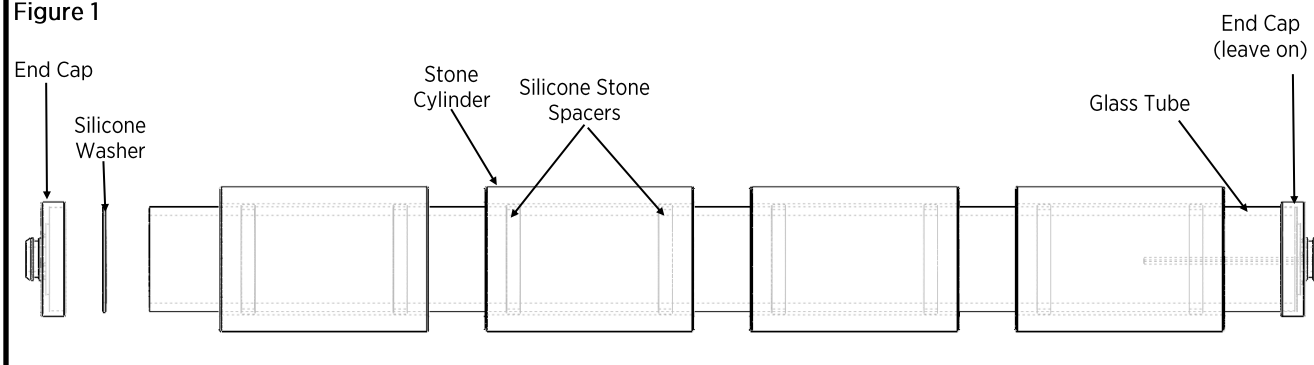


Step 13: Push the lightbar end into the end housing (E) until you can hear the detent snap into place. Repeat this for the center housing (D). Once light bar is in place, tighten set screw from the top access hole using the .050" Allen key until the screw bottoms out.



Step 14: Make any final adjustments to aircraft cable in the canopies to ensure the lightbars are level. Once fixture is in place, use cable grippers to snip off any excess aircraft cable.

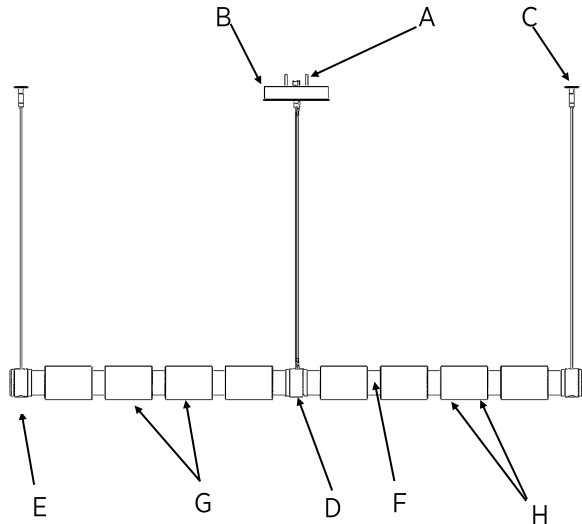

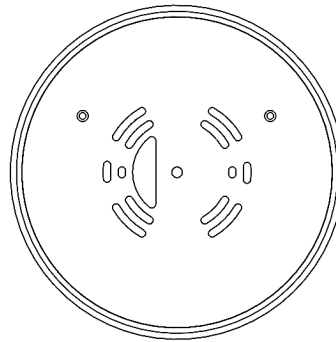

Assembly Instructions

Step 1: Remove the faceplate from Canopy (B) by pulling the faceplate, which is connected by magnets, off of the canopy.

Step 2: Mount Canopy (B) to ceiling using Hardware Packet T (A) and included instructions.

HARDWARE PACKET T: MOUNTS TO J-BOX

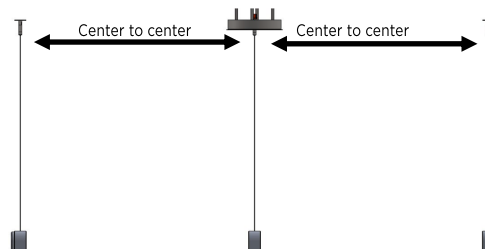


Warning: Source Power should be turned off. Failing to do so may result in damage to the fixture.

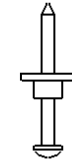
Step 3: Make wire connections to source power, connecting white wire to white wire (Neutral) and Black wire to Black wire (hot).

Step 4: Run the aircraft cable and coaxial power cable of the Center Housing (D.) through the faceplate then insert the aircraft cable into the canopy cable gripper. Leave the coaxial power cable disconnected.

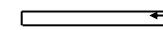
Step 5: Measure out and mark 35" from the center of the J-box in both directions. This is the mounting location for the Satellite cable grippers.



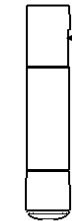
Step 6: Once the mounting location is identified, screw the provided toggle bolt body into the drywall using a Phillips head screw driver (see E-Z Toggle instructions below). Once the toggle bolt body is in place, run the provided toggle bolt screw through the satellite cable gripper then screw into the toggle bolt body until it is secured firmly in place. Repeat for the other side.



The bottom adapter of the satellite gripper gets held to the ceiling with the screw from the EZ Toggle



Excision plate



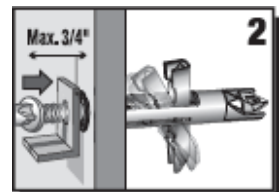
Unscrew the top of the satellite gripper

E-Z Toggle™ Instructions

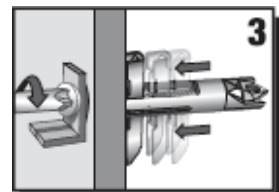
Turn E-Z Toggle into drywall until seated flush. Arrows on head indicate direction toggle clamp will open. End with arrows up and down.



Place fixture over E-Z Toggle. Push screw into E-Z Toggle to engage clamp



Turn screw until it stops. Toggle clamp tightens against drywall as screw is turned.

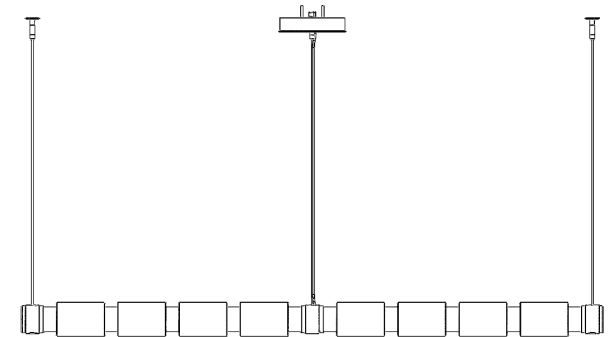
