When Highland Park's Jamie Schachtel, a principal of Jamie Schachtel Design Group (jamieschachtel.com), needed a light fixture for her clients' dining room, she had an idea of what they might like. "I know them pretty well; she's more feminine and he's a little edgier," she says. "I thought this Sputnik-type fixture with its unique glass shades would appeal to both of them." She, of course, was right, and the just-introduced Hammerton Studio Blossom Starburst chandelier now hangs over the family's dining room table in a very visible spot.
